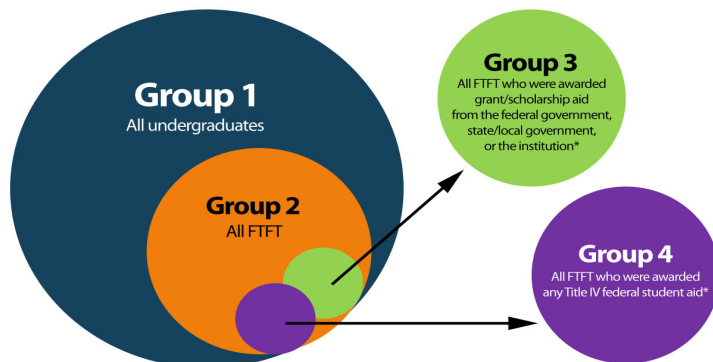
Overview
